# A-level fieldtrips

Y12 Geographers spent two days in the field conducting fieldwork as part of their A-level course.

The first day was spent at Winterton-on-Sea profiling the dune system from the foredunes (most recently formed) to the climatic climax community (established dunes at the back). This involved measuring changes in gradient and amount and diversity of vegetation. They also got to see first-hand the impacts of rapid rates of erosion along our coastline as well as sampling some fish and chips!

On day two students visited Stratford, London to investigate how the perceptions of residents vary across the town. The investigation was carried out in both the regenerated areas (Olympic Park and former Athletes Village) as well as older more established parts such as the original Stratford Shopping Centre speaking to locals about their experiences. A great day was had by everyone, and it finished with a trip to the Westfield Centre!
