What training have they (staff) had?

Mrs Somers

- Mrs Somers has 9 years experience in the role of SENCO. She has also worked as a Head of Year and is a qualified teacher. She is allocated time within a week to manage SEN provision.
- She achieved the National Award in Special Educational Needs Co-Ordination in 2019.
- She has completed **Trauma Informed training** as well as **additional training for SPLD**, **Autism Spectrum Disorder and ADHD Awareness**. She is a Level 7 qualified Exam Access Arrangements Assessor and holds a CPT3A which enables her to complete additional educational testing.

Mrs Palmer

- Mrs Palmer has 12 years experience in this role and has also worked as a primary school teaching assistant.
- She has training in Nurture, Trauma and supporting students with; SPLD, Autism Spectrum Disorder and ADHD.
- She is the lead for ASDAN courses which offered as part of our provision.

Teachers

• In 2022 all staff undertook Trauma Informed training and in September 2023 all staff have received specific training in Norfolk's Provision Expected as SEND Support (Norfolk PEASS). A programme of continuous training is available in specialist areas through our Continuing Professional Development programme. This enables all teachers and support staff the opportunity to complete short courses in all areas of SEND to help tailor their knowledge to the needs in their classes.

Teaching Assistants

• Our Teaching Assistants have been trained in Literacy, Numeracy and Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) interventions as well as Trauma Informed Practice and Norfolk PEASS (Provision Expected as SEND Support).

The Safeguarding Team

- Some students will need further support from our safeguarding team.
- This is so we can keep them as safe as possible. This includes keeping them safe from physical and emotional harm.

How will I be involved in decisions made about my child's education?

• We will provide three paper reports on your child's progress each year. In addition to this your child's teachers will meet with you annually to:

Set clear outcomes for your child's progress



Review progress towards those outcomes



Discuss the support we will put in place to help your child make that progress



Identify what we will do, what we will ask you to do, and what we will ask your child to do

- In Year 7 there is also an additional in person appointment offered to discuss how your child has managed the transition to High School.
- The SENCO (Mrs Somers) may also attend these meetings to provide extra support.
- If you have any concerns that arise between these meetings, please contact your child's <u>Head of Year</u>.





How will Diss High School adapt its teaching for my child?

High-quality teaching is our first step in responding to your child's needs. We will
make sure that your child has access to a broad and balanced curriculum in every
year they are at our school.



- We will differentiate (or adapt) how we teach to suit the way the pupil works best.
 There is no '1 size fits all' approach to adapting the curriculum, we work on a case-by
 case basis to make sure the adaptations we make are meaningful to your child. See

English as an additional language


- Students who have English as an additional language (EAL)
 are supported by our EAL coordinator, Mr Outred.
- Mr Outred works with our SENCO to make sure every SEN student gets the support they need.



How will the school support with mental health and emotional and social development?



Pupils with SEN are encouraged to be part of the school council and the Learning Support Centre (LSC) Lunch club which promotes team building and friendships.







We provide extra pastoral support for listening to the views of pupils with SEN by having specially trained SEMH (Social, Emotional and Mental Health) support through a variety of staff members, including our <u>safeguarding team</u>. Alongside this we have a **zero tolerance approach to bullying**, you can find our bullying policy <u>here</u>.





What support will be available for my child as they transition between year groups?

Your child's Head of Year will usually stay the same while at our school. Where possible their Head of Year in Year 7 will be their Head of Year in Year 11.

The rest of their pastoral team will be kept the same as much as possible.

Timetables are available during the summer before the autumn term begins.

Students can meet staff they do not know as soon as possible.



What support will be available for my child as they transition between schools?

When leaving us, we will share as much information with your child's new school as you want to. This information is sent securely.

When joining us, your child's head of year shares information about your child with their teachers and support staff. They will also work with our SENCO so your child's support can continue as soon as possible after joining us.



What support will be available for my child as they transition into secondary school?

Mrs Somers (SENCO) will meet with primary school SENCOs to discuss the needs of incoming pupils near the end of the summer term. This is to discuss how we can best support and welcome the child into our community.



We have Year 11 mentors in every Year 7 tutor group to support with transition and answer questions - providing a "buddy" role.





What support will be available for my child as they transition into adulthood?

We provide all our pupils with appropriate advice on paths into work or further education.

Our Head of Sixth Form provides additional support to Year 13 SEN students to smooth their transition into further education or employment.







What should I do if I have a complaint about my child's SEN support?
